There is a lot of chatter about the **changes to the Bowls England competitions.** Nothing will change for 2024. Please see the Bowls England website for the changes that will come into place for 2025.

I posted a post on Facebook this week regarding Pershore closing for holidays just before Learnington. Pershore is where we take our bowls to have them restamped. It appears to have confused a lot of people who instantly took to their phones to call Sheron, John or myself. There are 2 things I now would like to explain:

1) To play in any competition your bowls must have a date of 1985 or later stamped on them. However if you are good enough to get to 'The National Finals' then your bowls MUST be in date. This means that the date stamp must show at least 2024. If the date is 2023 or before then you need to get them restamped.

2) Despite letting you all know that there is a new system in place within Bowls Surrey a few people grabbed their phones and called us directly and instantly! Please remember that if you have any queries your first calls should be to the Area contacts within your Area, they will escalate if they cannot answer.

Umpires Corner - Last Months Question comes from an email I received: I watched the World Bowls at Potters on television like many others and was a bit surprised that certain rules were being ignored. I understand that players once they deliver their bowl, if following their bowl, they must be behind the head before their bowl comes to rest. Why were the players ignoring this?

My Reply: The World Bowls at Potters is governed by World Bowls and they have their own set of rules specifically for this venue. At Potters they have a time limit on most delivered bowls which means that this main 'possession law' can be overlooked. You will notice that none of the players get in their opponents way and that no players complain or get annoyed that their opponent walks up the rink whilst it is in their possession. In normal play the players should be behind the mat or behind the head when their bowl comes to rest and they must NOT be annoying their opponent by being anywhere else.
